Attention residents,

Electronic products are the fastest growing portion of the solid waste stream. In 2007, 3.0 million tons of electronic products became obsolete yet only 14% of those products were actually recycled. Many of these electronic products contain lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, and other materials that pose environmental and health risks that must be managed.

Beginning January 1, 2012, the following electronic items will be banned from Illinois landfills (P.A. 97-0287) from all sources under penalty of law.
